About the Speakers

Robin Kirk MSc, DO

Robin Kirk is the Principal of the London School of Osteopathy. He has practised as an osteopath and naturopath for more than forty years. He is a past Editor of the *British Osteopathic Journal*. Robin is a Trustee of the National Osteopathic Archive, an organisation concerned with the preservation of historical materials connected to the history of osteopathy and related healthcare disciplines, especially naturopathy and musculo-skeletal medicine.

Francis Wilson, DC, MSc, PhD

Francis Wilson is a Senior Lecturer at the Anglo-European College of Chiropractic. He is the President of the British Society for the History of Chiropractic and Director of the AECC's historical collections. Francis is a member of the Editorial Advisory Board for the journal *Chiropractic History*. He edited the book *Chiropractic in Europe: an Illustrated History* (2007). His doctoral study explored the origins and professional development of chiropractic in Britain.

Christina Cunliffe PhD, DC

Christina Cunliffe is the Dean of the BPP School of Health and the Principal of the McTimoney College of Chiropractic. She is a member of the General Chiropractic Council. Christina gained her PhD from the University of Manchester. In 2010 she was awarded a Personal Chair by the University of Wales.
